Think about a few basics ahead of time, such as bringing a hair brush to school with you for quick touch-ups and limiting exposure to the sun a few days before Picture Day. Other things to keep in mind include checking your hair and shirt collar at camera time, practicing your smile, remembering good posture, and relaxing and smiling at the camera as if it's your best friend. Important Reminders for Parents and Guardians

All medication must be handed in to the main office for proper storage. To ensure everyone's safety, students are not permitted to have medication in their possession. If your son or daughter is required to take medication during the school day, the school reguires a release form to be signed by a parent or guardian. If your son or daughter requires an Epi-pen, a waiver must be signed granting school personnel permission to administer the injection. Students with severe allergies should wear a medic alert bracelet or necklace clearly identifying his or her allergy. We promote an environment that is free from nuts, peanuts, tree nuts, sesame seed/ oil, sunflower seeds, shell fish and latex.

If your child is going to be absent from school, please call the office and inform us of the absence between 8:00-8:55 a.m. A call will

be made to your home if we did not receive a call from you, once we discover through morning attendance that your child is not at school-this does include snow days/no transportation days when schools are open. We need to know that your child is safe at home with you or another caregiver.

The Code of Conduct can be found on our school website. A copy is also being sent home with all students on Friday, September 6, 2019. Please review this important documentation at home with your son or daughter. All community members will work together to develop spiritually, intellectually, physically, socially, and emotionally by aspiring to the highest possible standards of Catholic conduct, in living out the gospel values, and by fostering a Catholic culture of respect, responsibility and concern for the common good.

The Importance of the Home/School Partnership

Children learn best when the significant adults in their lives – parents, teachers, and other family and community members – work together to encourage and support them.

Parent involvement in schools leads to higher grades and test scores and better attendance and homework completion habits. These students also are likely to graduate and pursue higher education because their parents have taken an interest in their education and serve as role models.

Getting to know their students' parents helps teachers understand the environment and cultural influences that shape students' points of view and behaviour. This leads to improved communication between students and teachers, enhancing trust, mutual respect and the education process.

Parents who get to know their

children's teachers, about the curricula and the teachers' educational methods, are more likely than those who don't to help children with homework and ensure it's completed. And, by holding enjoyable family activities. schools encourage parental attendance and interest in participating in other useful activities, such as fundraising and volunteering in the classroom. These activities also strengthen bonds between parents and children. Interacting and working with parents to improve students' education provides outside points of view on operations and policies that can improve them.

The biggest winners in all of this are the children. When we walk into a school and see parents and teachers working together, in all sorts of roles, it's a sure sign that the school challenges the very best in students and helps all realize their fullest potential.

School Forms

All parents and guardians received a package of forms that need to be returned to the school by Monday, September 9, 2019. Here is a brief explanation of each form:



We strive to support highquality learning while giving every child the opportunity to learn in the way that is best.

- Student Information Sheet This form is necessary to help us keep up to date information on your son or daughter. It is vital that this information be kept current. Should there be any changes to the information provided (i.e. work phone numbers) during the course of the school year, please contact the office at your earliest convenience.
- Information Release Form To protect the privacy of students, your consent is required for your son or daughter's name or photograph to be published or displayed. We strongly

encourage all parents to consider allowing their children to be photographed as it can be so rewarding for them to be included with the rest of the group.

- Acceptable Use Agreement The Sudbury Catholic District School Board is committed to establishing guidelines and expectations regarding the ethical and responsible use of the Internet and Information Technology. Students are expected to abide by the Student Responsible Use of Information Technology Agreement. The school will require that students and their parent/guardian sign a Student Responsible Use of Information Technology Agreement.
- Student Accident Insurance If your child is involved in an accident, whether at school or during non-school hours, 'insuremykids' protects your family from the resulting expenses, which are not normally covered under your government health and group insurance plans.
- School Bus Discipline Policy Guidelines
